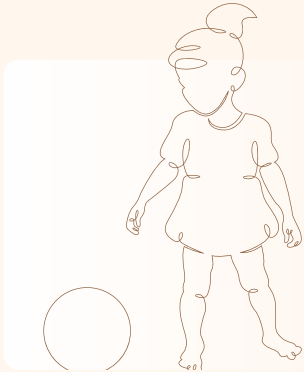

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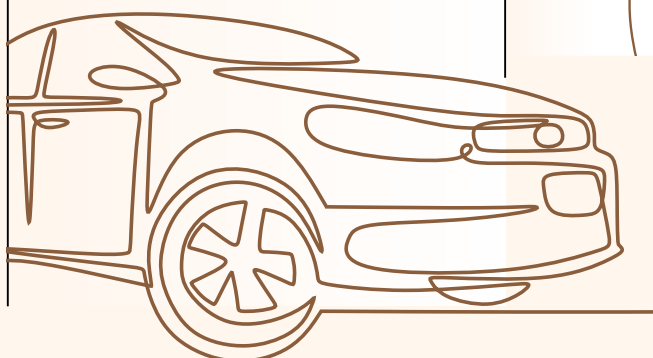
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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we move towards our 60th year, I am confident that together, we will continue to strengthen trust, embrace innovation, and advance the general insurance sector for the benefit of all.

The year ahead also carries special significance. As GIA prepares to mark its 60th anniversary in 2026, we do so with a clear sense of honouring our legacy while remaining firmly focused on the future. This milestone offers an opportunity to reaffirm the

positive role we play in society and to spotlight the collective impact of our members in supporting individuals, businesses, and communities through changing times.

WELCOMING THE RETURN OF GLOBAL MARINE INSURANCE'S FLAGSHIP CONFERENCE

A defining highlight of the year was Singapore's hosting of the International Union of Marine Insurance (IUMI) 2025 Singapore Conference. Held from 7 to 10 September at the Resorts World Convention Centre in Sentosa, the conference marked the return of IUMI's flagship event to Singapore after more than two decades. With the theme "Charting Opportunities in Changing Tides," the conference brought together over 750 participants from more than 30 national marine insurance and reinsurance associations, alongside partners from across the global maritime ecosystem. It provided a platform for forward-looking dialogue against a timely backdrop of geopolitical uncertainty and evolving trade dynamics. This full-circle homecoming highlighted how far Singapore has come, and also its pivotal role as a global hub for marine insurance and global trade.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

DELIVERING PRACTICAL IMPROVEMENTS TO ENHANCE EFFICIENCY, TRANSPARENCY, AND COLLABORATION

Operationally, GIA continues to deliver practical improvements that enhance efficiency, transparency, and collaboration across the sector.

In July 2025, we successfully launched the integration of the GIA Easy Accident Reporting System (GEARS) with the Singapore Police Force's next-generation case management system, CRIMES3. This integration replaces a previously manual process, enabling accident report screening requests and responses to be exchanged seamlessly through system interfaces. By streamlining workflows and reducing administrative friction, this initiative effectively harnesses technology to better support our members and public-sector partners.

Upholding trust and safeguarding the integrity of the industry remain core priorities. In January 2025, GIA introduced the FMS SMART Watchlist, an enhancement to the Fraud Management System. Developed through close collaboration between the Insurance Fraud Committee and industry partners, the watchlist enables members to flag suspicious entities and share intelligence across the sector. This shared intelligence layer strengthens collective defences against fraud while enhancing operational efficiency.

ADVANCING PUBLIC EDUCATION AND CROSS-SECTOR COLLABORATION FOR POSITIVE IMPACT

Beyond operations and enforcement, we continued to invest in public education and engagement. GIA was proud to participate in the Traffic Police's Use Your Road Sense 10th Anniversary Exhibition, where we operated an interactive booth focused on child road safety. Through hands-on activities and educational materials, parents and caregivers were engaged on the importance of proper child restraints and injury prevention, reinforcing the message that prevention not only saves lives but also reduces avoidable harm and costs.

We also took steps to advance cross-sector collaboration to improve the healthcare and insurance experience for Singaporeans. Building on

the Healthcare and Insurance Industry Pilot (HIIP), GIA has worked alongside industry partners to support the development of integrated digital-first approaches to hospitalisation claims. By improving data interoperability, streamlining claims workflows, and enabling more seamless information exchange, HIIP reflects our shared commitment to delivering more transparent, efficient, and patient-centric outcomes.

STRENGTHENING CONSUMER TRUST AND CONFIDENCE AS A SECTOR PRIORITY

On the culture and conduct front, we completed the third and final year of the *Insurance Trust Indicator Study (ITIS)*. Over the past three years, the study has served as an important benchmark for understanding public trust and identifying areas for improvement across the insurance ecosystem. While trust-building is a long-term endeavour, the completion of this study marks a meaningful milestone in reinforcing accountability and raising standards across the industry.

GIA 60 STRONG AND BEYOND

As we look ahead to GIA's 60th anniversary, we are preparing a year-long commemorative campaign to celebrate this milestone. The campaign will spotlight stories, moments, and milestones that reflect the sector's positive impact over six decades and beyond, under the themes "Enabling lives and business" and "Rebuilding lives and property". We look forward to bringing the community together at a 60th Anniversary Dinner to celebrate our shared journey and look ahead to the next 60 years.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to our members, partners, committee and workgroup members, and the GIA Secretariat for your continued dedication and support. Your collective contributions enable GIA to remain responsive, resilient, and forward-looking. As we move towards our 60th year, I am confident that together, we will continue to strengthen trust, embrace innovation, and advance the general insurance sector for the benefit of all.

Let us move forward with shared purpose and renewed conviction, ready to meet the challenges ahead and seize the opportunities that lie beyond.

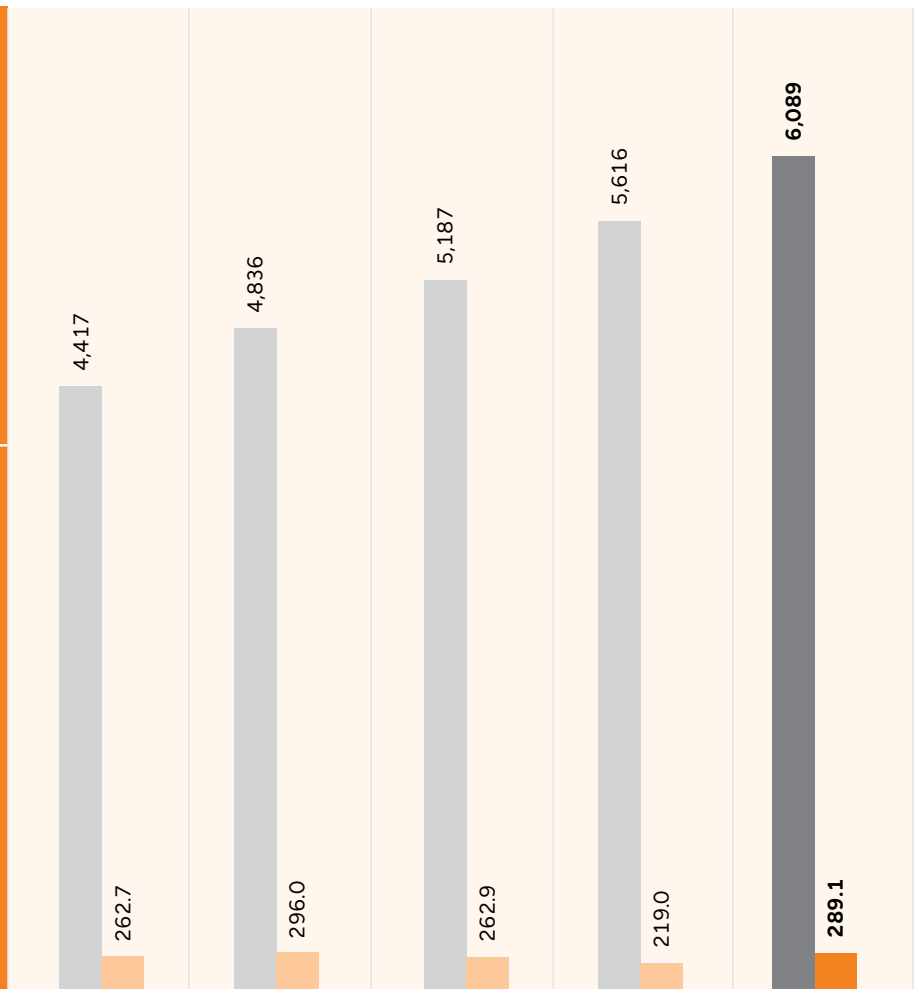

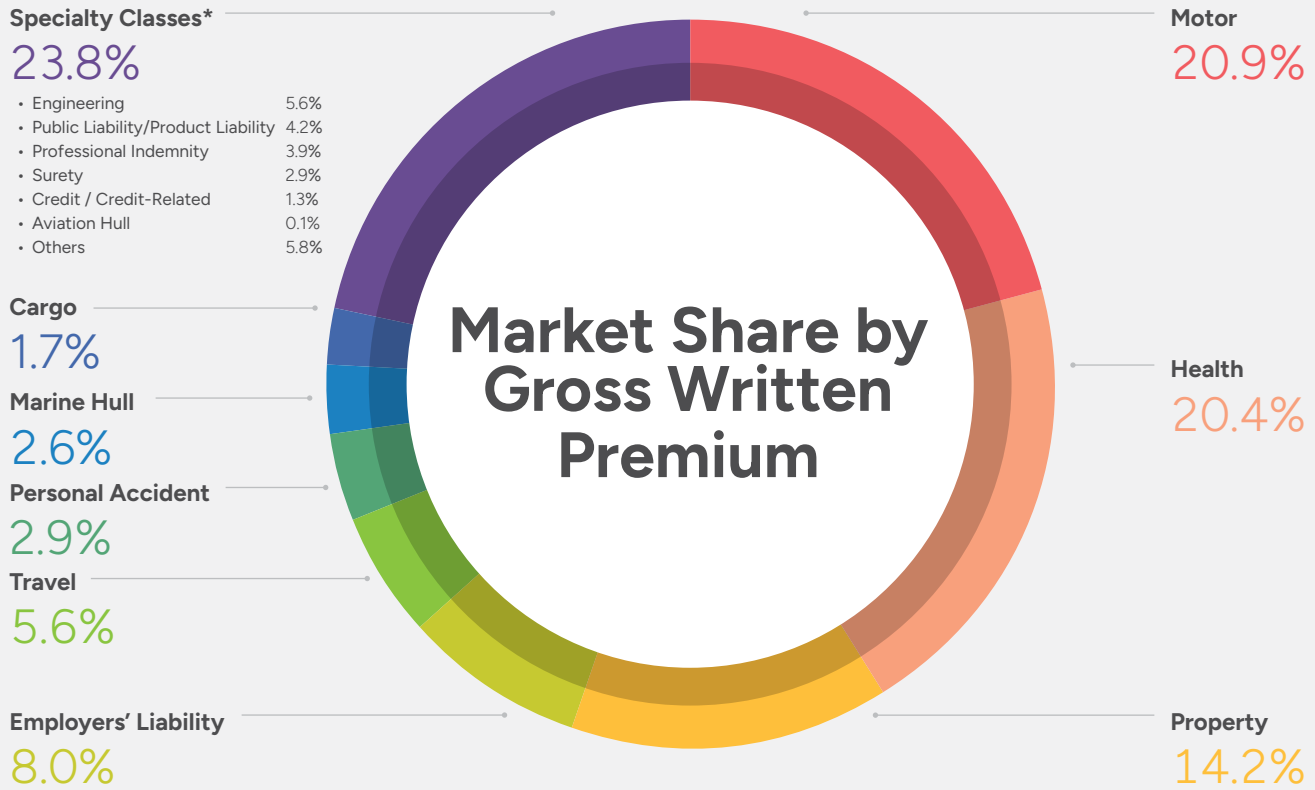

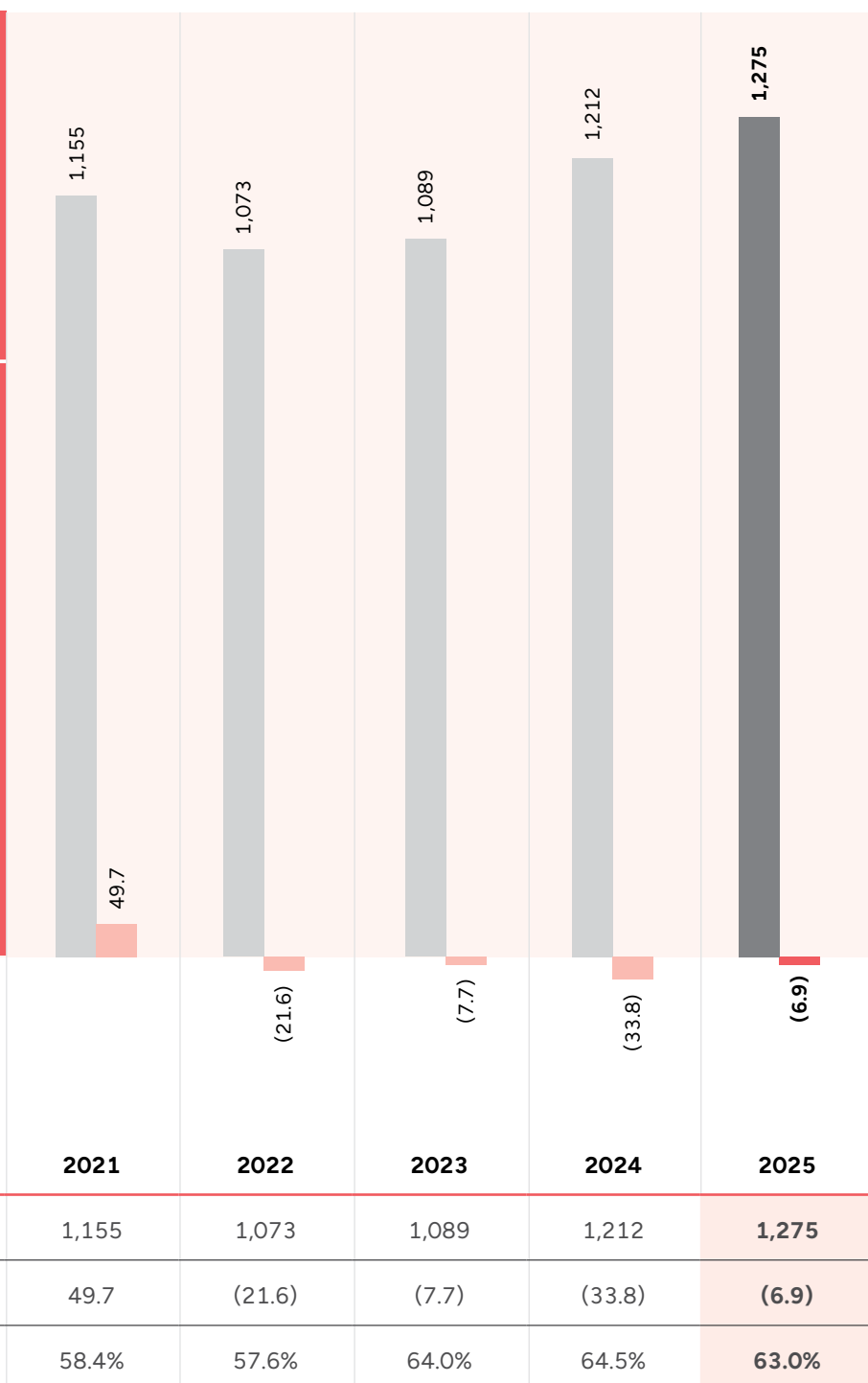

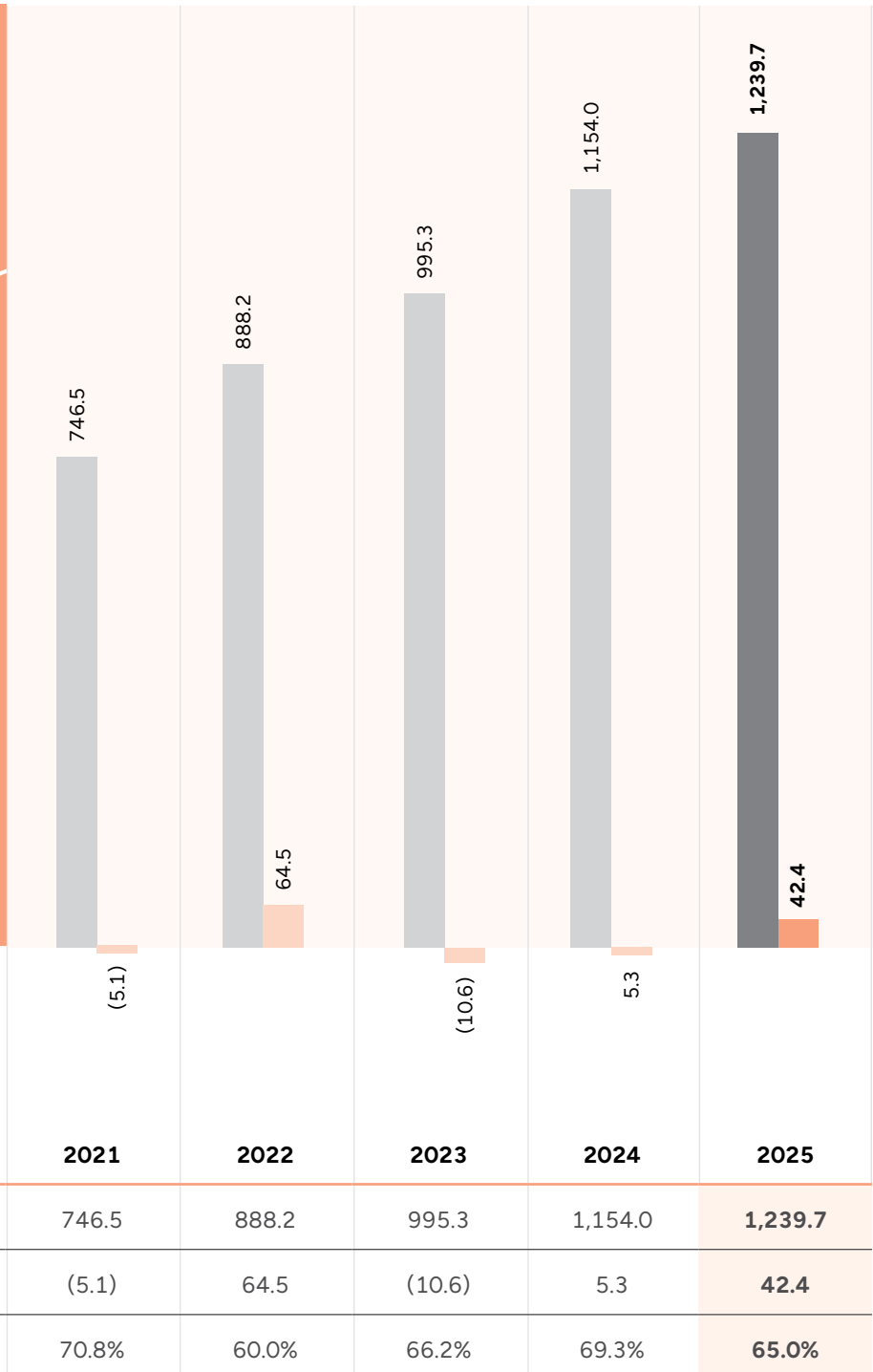

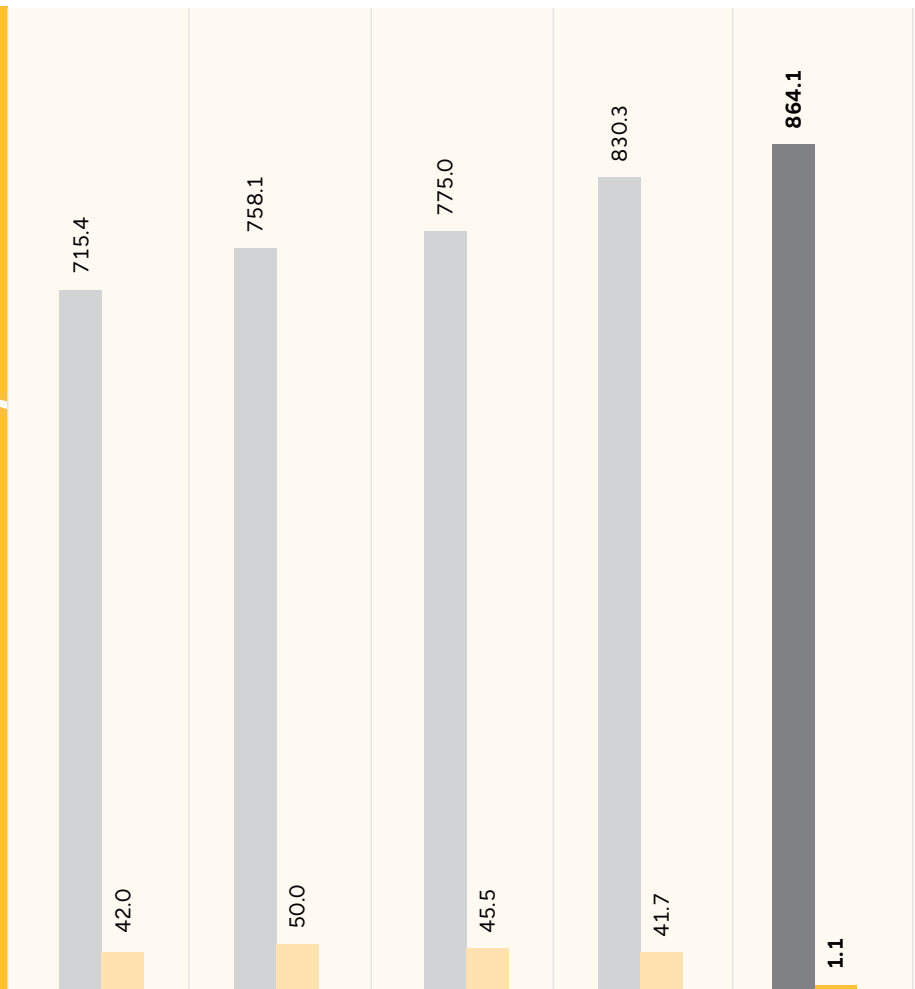

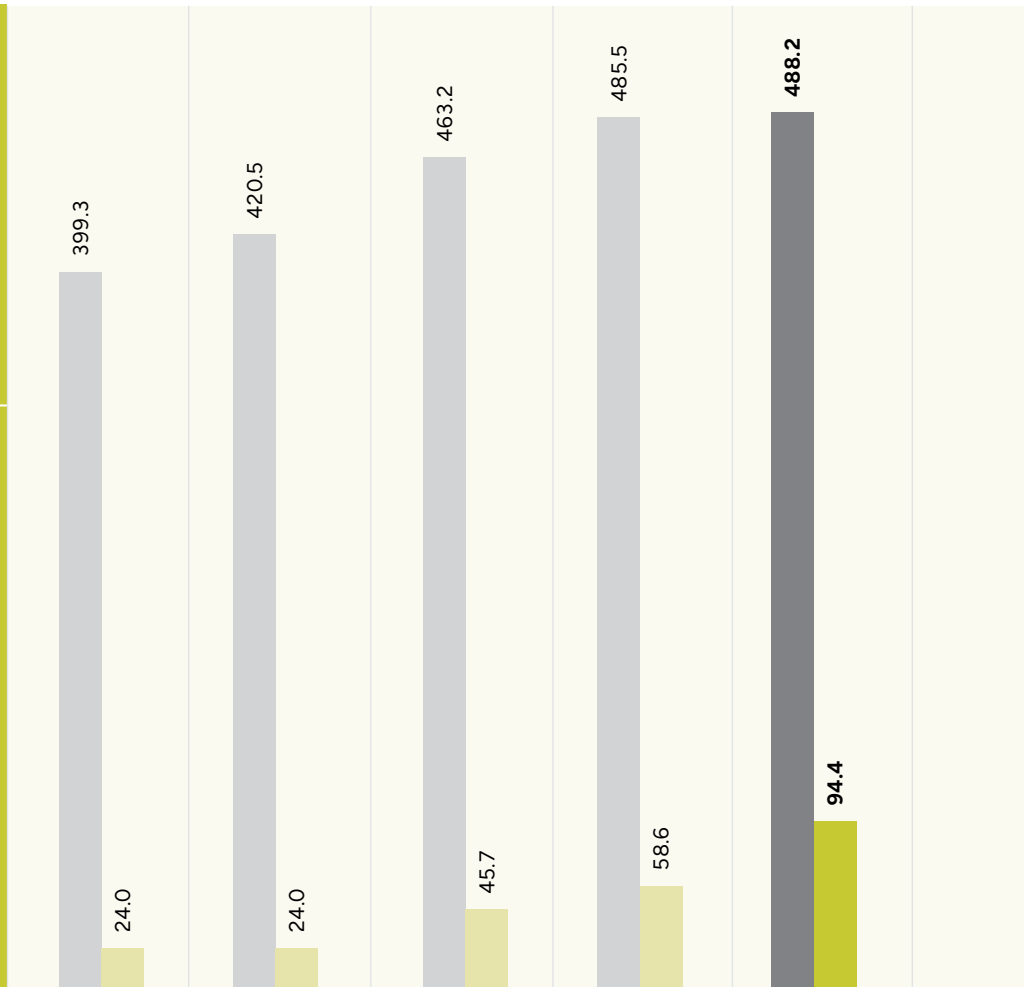

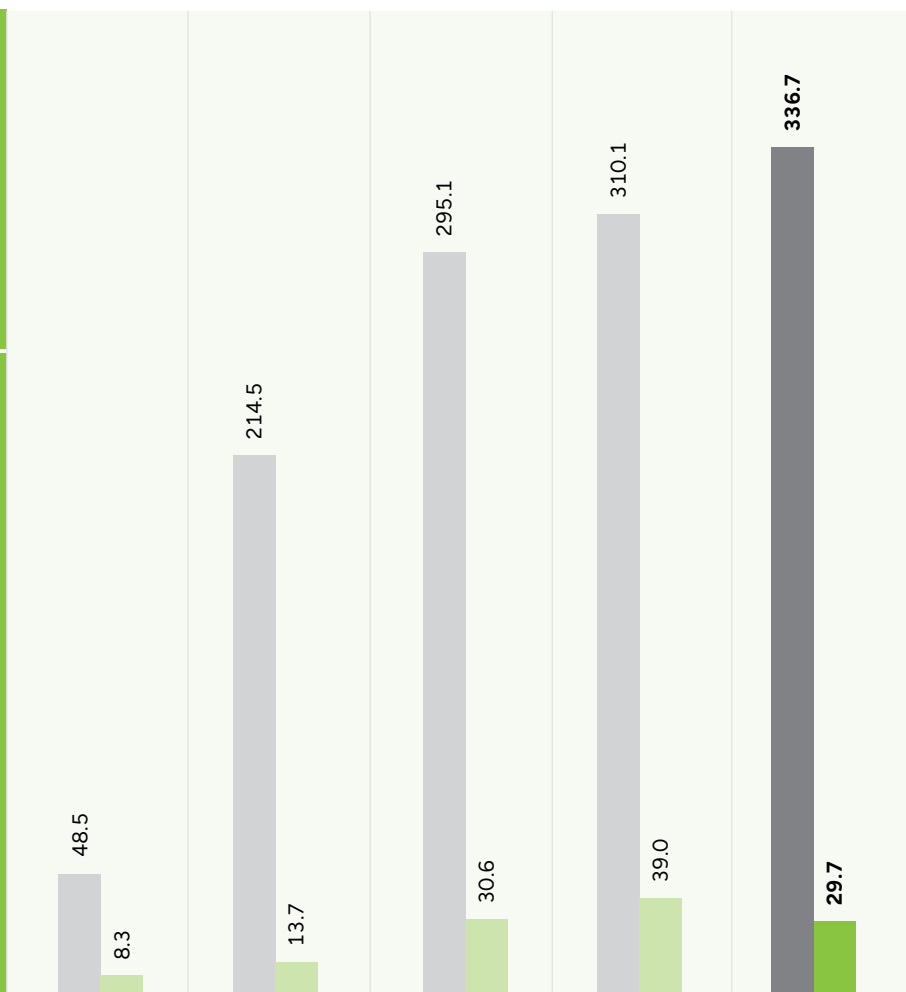

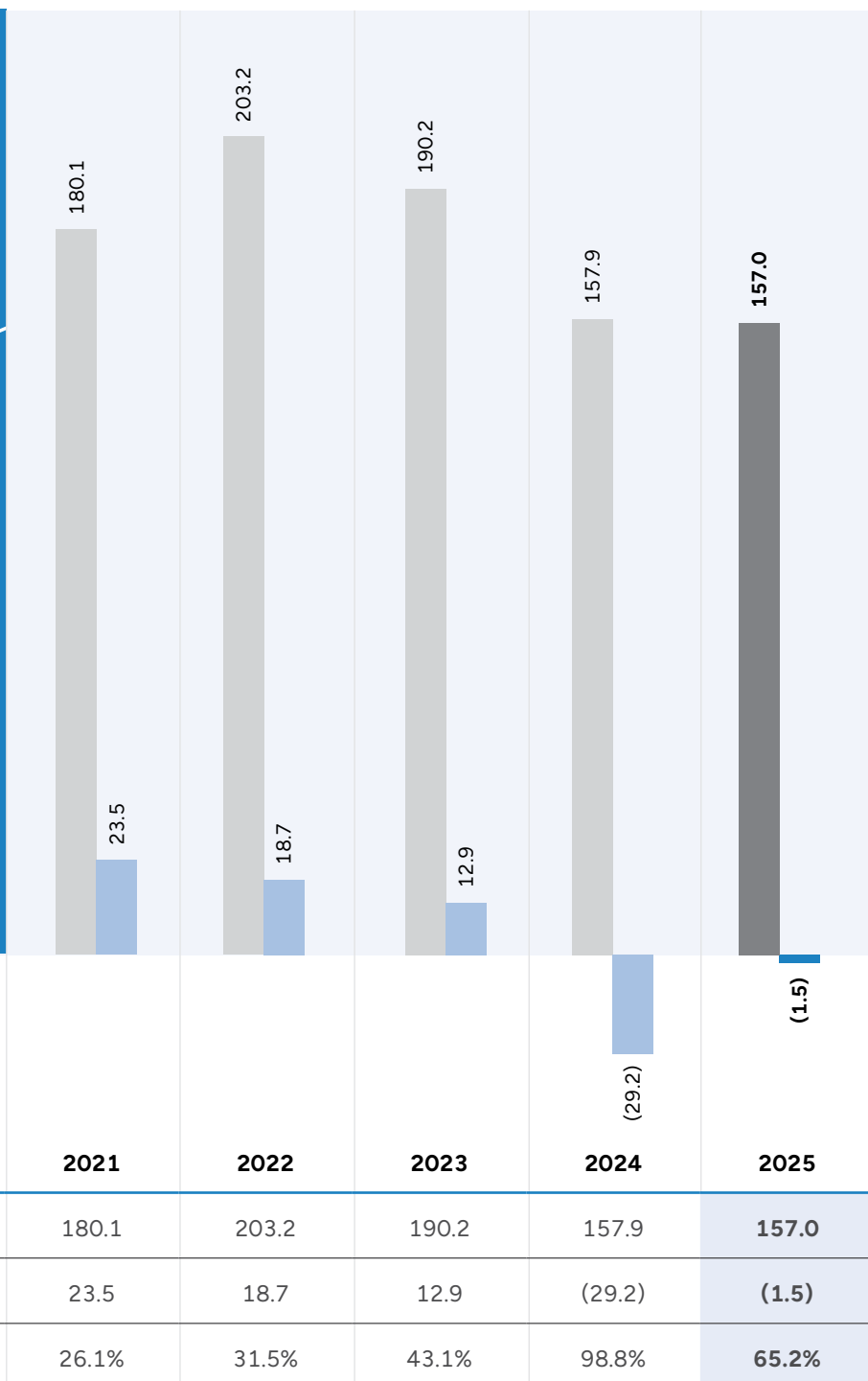

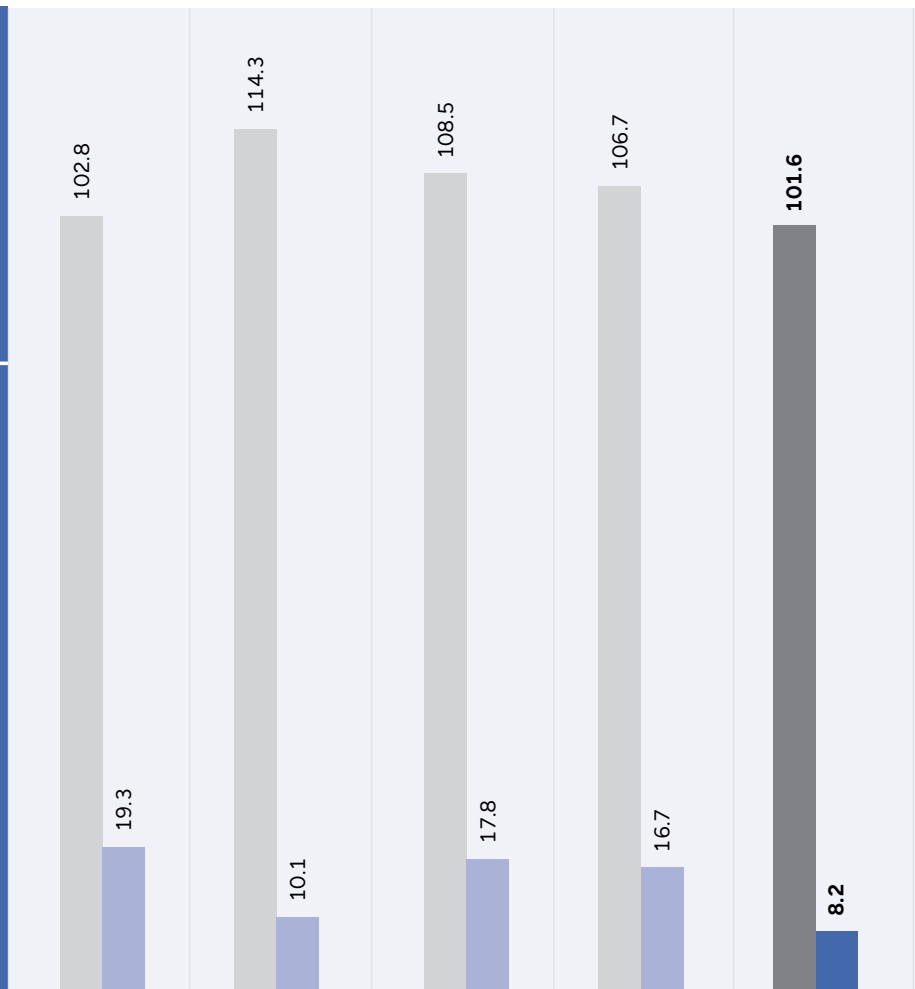

RETURN OF GLOBAL MARINE INSURANCE'S FLAGSHIP CONFERENCE

We were proud to host the International Union of Marine Insurance's (IUMI) Singapore Conference 2025 from 7 to 10 September at the Resorts World Convention Centre in Sentosa. The conference marked the return of the global marine insurance community's flagship event to Singapore after two decades.

Anchored on the theme "Charting Opportunities in Changing Tides", the four-day conference convened over 750 delegates from more than 30 national marine insurance and reinsurance associations, together with partners across the global maritime ecosystem.

Against the global backdrop of emerging trends, concerns, and opportunities, the conference served as a timely platform for forward-looking dialogue amid geopolitical uncertainty and shifting trade dynamics. The full-circle homecoming underscored Singapore's maritime development and reaffirmed its pivotal role as a global hub for marine insurance.



A. Shaping Engagement, Connecting Ideas, and Cultivating Future Talents



**SBCC X GIA CHALLENGE 2025
CASE COMPETITION**

In March 2025, we co-organised a case competition with the Nanyang Technological University Business Solutions Club. Open to polytechnic and university students from all disciplines, the challenge invited participants to generate innovative ideas and compete for cash prizes of up to S\$5,000.

The finals, held on 7 March 2025, featured the top eight teams pitching their proposals to a panel of judges drawn from the insurance, insurance broking, reinsurance, and loss adjusting sectors.

A total of 125 teams participated in the case competition.

Practical Improvements to Enhance Efficiency, Transparency, and Collaboration



FRAUD MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (FMS) SMART WATCHLIST SYSTEM

In January 2025, the Insurance Fraud Committee developed and launched the Smart Watchlist system enhancement to the FMS. The new feature enables members to flag suspicious or fraudulent cases, creating a shared intelligence resource across the sector. This helps strengthen the sector's fraud detection capabilities and enhances operational efficiency through identifying early alerts and shared insights.

A new feature was also added to the FMS in May 2025, promoting stronger collaboration between insurers on complex cases. Recognising that complex fraud schemes often involve multiple insurers, the "Build a Network" feature was implemented in the FMS to foster information exchanged and provide a visual framework for mapping intricate fraud patterns. This new feature helps accelerate fraud investigations but also unveils complex fraud patterns otherwise unrecognised.

LOW VALUE WHIPLASH INJURY CLAIMS PAPER

In 2024, the Motor Committee conducted a study of low value (i.e. claim amounts or settled amounts of <\$10,000) whiplash injury claims to help identify common issues and trends in insurers' management of low value whiplash injury claims.

Findings of the study were published in a paper in January 2025 and shared with members. Key findings were highlighted to help the sector identify insights and implement measures to address claims frauds concerns, reduce opportunistic fraud, and help the sector control costs association with whiplash claims.



B. Practical Improvements to Enhance Efficiency, Transparency, and Collaboration



GIA EASY ACCIDENT REPORTING SYSTEM (GEARS) PLATFORM INTEGRATION WITH CRIMES3

In July 2025, we completed a system integration between the GEARS platform with the Singapore Police Force's CRIMES3 investigation case management system. Replacing a previously manual process, the integration enables enforcement officers to request and receive accident reports seamlessly through GEARS. This initiative helps the sector better support collaboration between our members and public-sector partners.



HEALTHCARE AND INSURANCE INDUSTRY PILOT (HIIP) PILOT REPORT

In July 2021, a cross-industry alliance between the General Insurance Association Singapore (GIA Singapore), Life Insurance Association, Singapore (LIA Singapore), and Integrated Health Information Systems (IHIS) jointly kickstarted a project to develop an integrated platform for hospitalisation claims. The integrated platform aims to serve as an end-to-end health insurance claims platform to improve patient experience and enhance operational efficiency.

A six-month pilot to establish a Minimum Viable Product (MVP) was carried out and concluded in February 2025. Participating entities included three restructured hospitals, one insurer offering Integrated Shield Plans, and one insurer offering Employee Benefits Insurance. A summary of the MVP pilot was distributed to members in June 2025 and outlined key outcomes in process efficiencies, elimination of duplicate claims and overpayments, and improved patient/insured experience.

GIA and LIA will continue collaborating with government agencies and engaging members offering health insurance products through workgroups or workstreams to develop and implemented the proposed platform.



STRENGTHENING CONSUMER

TRUST AND CONFIDENCE AS A SECTOR PRIORITY

C. Strengthening Consumer Trust and Confidence as a Sector Priority



INSURANCE TRUST INDICATOR STUDY (ITIS) 2025

In October 2025, we finalised findings from the third and final ITIS, which was conducted mid-2025 surveying 3,400 consumers, 300 managers from SMEs, and 200 managers from corporations in Singapore. Key insights from the latest ITIS 2025 indicated a downward trend in consumer trust levels, prompting the ICCSC to develop a strategic roadmap to enhance trust levels and identify key areas for action. The strategic roadmap builds on previously announced general insurance sector-level action plans and sets out initiatives across four key pillars including establishing foundational industry-wide best practices and standards, capability building, and recognition initiatives.

We will continue to work alongside members and support their efforts to improve trust and deliver fair and positive outcomes for customers.

The ITIS was a study commissioned by the industry-wide Insurance Culture and Conduct Steering Committee (ICCSC) over a three-year period from 2023 to 2025. It is part of the ICCSC’s and industry’s ongoing efforts to assess the levels of trust in the insurance industry and identify areas where consumers and businesses’ trust in life insurers, general insurers, and insurance intermediaries (e.g. insurance agents, brokers, financial advisers) in Singapore can be improved. The ICCSC comprises members from 13 insurers, reinsurers, and industry associations in Singapore.

PROPOSED RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE CLAIMS AND PRODUCT TRANSPARENCY

As part of sector-level efforts to foster sound culture and conduct standards and best practices, the General Insurance Subcommittee (GISC) was formed in 2024 as a subcommittee of the ICCSC.

In March 2025, the GISC conducted a sector-wide survey to collect data and feedback on common claims complaints, turnaround times, and customer communications. Findings from the survey were used to develop a proposed best practice paper which outlined recommendations on improving claims transparency to help simplify the claims process for customers and on enhancing product transparency to elevate customer awareness and education. A members’ consultation was carried out in August 2025, and the paper is expected to be finalised by Q2 2026.

As the alternative dispute resolution institution for Singapore's financial industry, FIDReC works closely with GIA as an industry partner. As part of an ongoing partnership with FIDReC to engage general insurers on sector pain points and identify recurring dispute themes, GIA and FIDReC jointly presented its fifth engagement session in February 2025.

The session focused on disputes resolution case studies from the motor, travel, and personal accident insurance segments. The in-person session also featured a panel discussion covering best practices and techniques in conflict handling and management, including insights from a FIDReC Adjudicator.

A visible and functional dispute resolution framework is critical to public trust, and this annual initiative is part of GIA and FIDReC's sector-education efforts on dispute prevention and resolution.

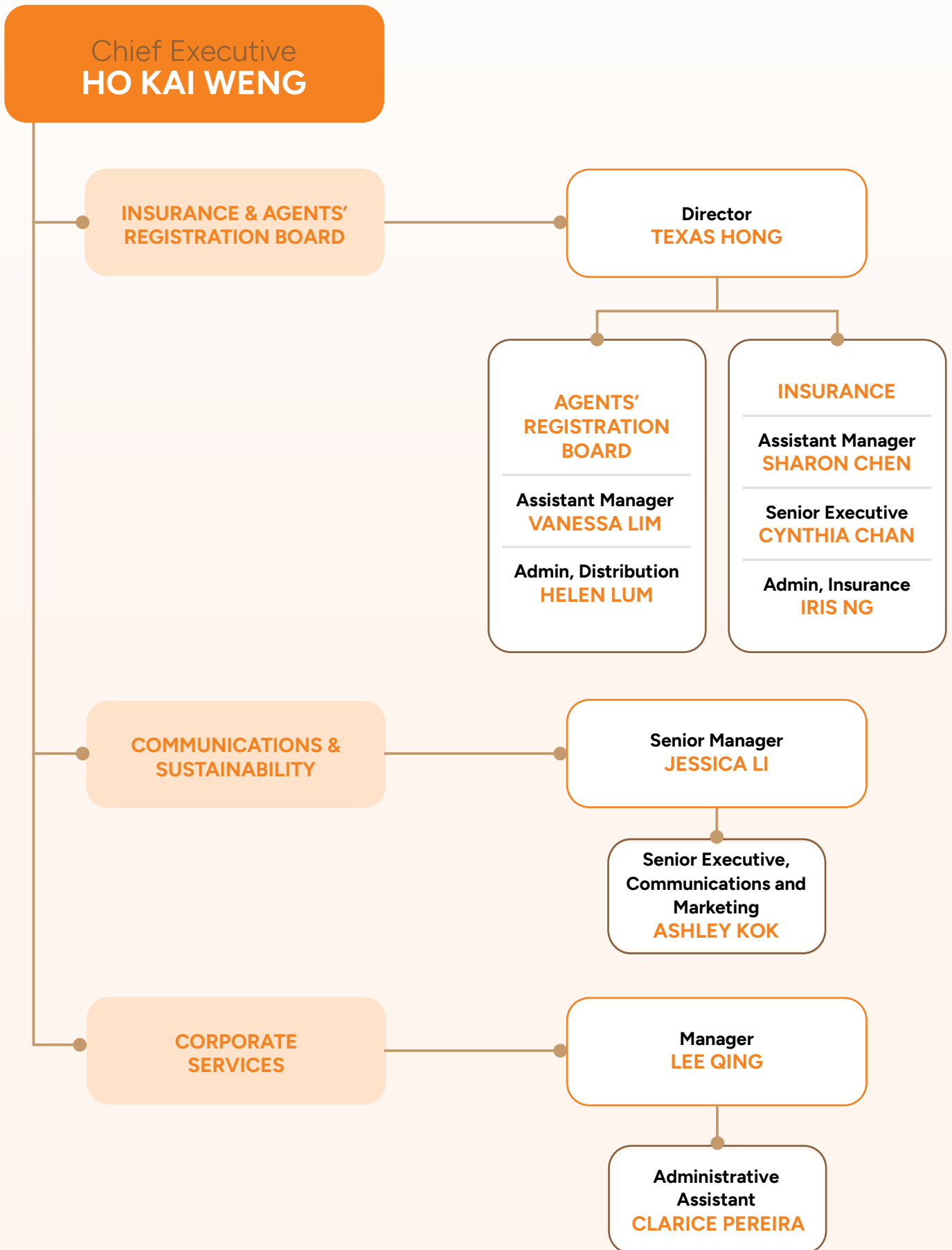
**TRAFFIC POLICE'S USE YOUR ROAD SENSE
